INHALATION HEALTH RISKS AND SYMPTOMS OF EXPOSURE

Dusts are corrosive to the entire respiratory tract. Breathing dust can destroy the mucous membranes and can cause pneumonitis.

STEPS TO BE TAKEN IN CASE MATERIAL IS RELEASED OR SPILLED
